Quarantine pests list of vine plants and grapes for OIV

Introduction

The issue of quarantine pests is very well regulated internationally in several standards and tries to harmonise the measures needed to ensure the safe trade of vine plants and their products including vine rooted and un-rooted, grafted and non-grafted cuttings, and table grapes around the world.

The international trade of all products and articles around the world is regulated and controlled by the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC; https://www.ippc.int/). The IPPC provides with all the relevant information regarding quarantine and trading requirements for all the countries around the world, by supporting trough Regional Plant Protection Organisations (RPPOs) or National Plant Protection Organisations (NPPOs) under its coordination.
