2025 OIV AWARDS WINNERS HONOURED IN DIJON

The 2025 OIV Awards Ceremony took place on 21 October 2025 at the Palais des Ducs et des États de Bourgogne in Dijon, France. This year, the International Organisation of Vine and Wine (OIV) honoured 13 books as the finest publications in the field of vine and wine.

The winners received their awards during a ceremony held in the prestigious Salle des États, presented by OIV President Yvette van der Merwe, Award Jury President Azéline Jaboulet-Vercherre, and Award Jury Scientific Secretary Richard Pfister.

The event gathered more than 100 attendees, including OIV experts and delegates, members of the diplomatic corps, and representatives from the publishing houses of the awarded books.

Out of 55 applications representing 19 countries—both OIV Member States and non-member States—a total of 13 books, including two digital publications, were distinguished as follows:

- 7 Awards

The Awards Jury was established in 1930 with the initial aim of stimulating research and technical progress in wine and viticulture. Over time, it has continually evolved in its categories, reflecting both the strategic priorities of the OIV and the changing landscape of publications related to wine and the vine.

In 2026, the OIV will introduce a new format for the Awards Jury, designed to be increasingly aligned with the current and future challenges of the world of vine and wine.

The International Organisation of Vine and Wine (OIV)

The OIV is a scientific and technical intergovernmental organisation, and the world reference to the vine and wine sector.

The OIV currently has 51 Member States, countries producing and consuming grapes and wine, which account for 90% of the world's vineyard surface area, 88% of global wine production and 75% of global wine consumption. Twice a year over 500 experts come together to assess, discuss and approve by consensus resolutions on the following:

- 1/ Viticulture and table grapes
- 2/ Oenology and methods of analysis
- 3/ Law and economics of the vine and wine
- 4/ Consumer health and safety

For a century the OIV has been at the forefront of all global vitivinicultural matters, providing standards, guidance and information for the vine and wine sector.
