



## Southern Hemisphere

#### Southern Hemisphere Wine Production




After a record high in 2021, vineyards in the **Southern Hemisphere** produced **55 mhl** in 2022, fully **in line with the average of the previous five years**.

All major wine-producing countries have registered a fall in production with respect to 2021, with the exception of New Zealand.


Overall, in 2022 the Southern Hemisphere wine production is expected to account for 21% of the world total.


#### Southern Hemisphere – Major Wine Producers, 2017-2022





## Northern Hemisphere






In the **European Union (EU)**, 2022 wine production is expected to be at **157 mhl**, recording an **annual increase of 3.5 mhl** (+2%) compared to 2021.

Positive performances in Italy, France, and Germany balanced out the low harvests in Spain, Portugal and Greece, which were particularly affected by drought and heat waves during growing season.


#### Northern Hemisphere - Major EU Wine Producers, 2017 - 2022




#### Northern Hemisphere - Major EU Wine Producers, 2017 - 2022



#### Northern Hemisphere - Major EU Wine Producers, 2017 - 2022




#### Northern Hemisphere - Major Wine Producers outside EU, 2017 - 2022





# World Wine Production 2022 A preliminary estimate



World wine production is expected to remain stable in 2022 at about 260 mhl, despite drought and heat waves that record in many regions of the world.

This will be the **fourth consecutive year** that global production is expected to be slightly below its 20-year average.
